

The Supportive Connections program assists people who may have needs for social services. Whether it is substance abuse issues, mental health challenges, or other basic needs, we work with a number of service agencies and providers to creatively meet the diverse needs of all who we support. Our aim is to bridge services from within the community by building connections where gaps in services may occur. Supportive Connections is voluntary program through the City of Ann Arbor, and not directly associated with any agency, courts, or law enforcement.

In a non-judgmental and non-coercive environment, Supportive Connections staff works with an individual to identity needs and develop solutions to creating stability and support in their life and family. Using a client centered approach, we tailor service connections to a participant's individual situation. Our case manager assists those in need to navigate existing community resources as much as possible.

Supportive Connections is open to anyone 18 years+ with a connection to Ann Arbor, whether it be living in the city (stably housed, transitionally housed, or homeless), earning income or working within the city, or attending Ann Arbor Schools (self or child). Regardless of level of need, level of income, or housing status, Supportive Connections is here to provide support. Some funding is available to support our mission, which can pay for things such as substance abuse treatment as needed. Financial ability to pay is not a barrier to receiving services.

Supportive Connections is open to participant referrals from the entire community, including family members. The referring person is kept confidential and will not be disclosed to the potential participant. An individual may also call for themselves to request assistance.
